Well Adult Clinic

The Nashoba Associated Boards of Health will offer their Well Adult Clinic on **Wednesday, September 13** from **11:15 AM to 12:15 PM** at the **Community Center**. This clinic allows adult residents to drop in for personalized one-on-one attention from our public health nurse, Alicia Lepardo. She can provide blood pressure checks, blood sugar screening, general health counseling, resource information, and referrals. There will not be a Well Adult Clinic in October due to the districtwide flu clinics that will be held that month.

Hello Residents!

Things to keep in mind as summer is coming to an end:

- Do not overload outlets or power strips.
- Repair or discard anything with a frayed wire.
- Use one appliance per outlet, especially if it is a heat generating appliance.
- Do not run electrical cords under rugs or let them get pinched by furniture.
- Use extension cords temporarily as they are not designed for long-term use.
- Place space heaters at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn.
- Have a licensed electrician inspect your electrical system every 10 years.

Boxborough Emergency Assistance Program (BEAP)

BEAP assists Boxborough residents with household expenses, such as medical, housing, transportation, and utilities. COA Van Services

COA van services are available to Boxborough residents age 60 or older and to adults with disabilities age 18 and above. Rides are offered **Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM**. The van travels to towns bordering Boxborough and may be used for medical appointments and local errands for \$1 each way. Medical rides to Concord are \$1 each way. Medical rides to other towns are subject to availability and rates are based on distance. Van trips to COA programs at the Community Center, to Town Hall, the Library, or to the Acton Food Pantry are free of charge. To book a ride, call 978-264-1730, preferably 2 days in advance.

We offer Boxborough seniors and disabled adults transportation, through our **Go Boxborough!** program, to medical appointments that are outside the service area, time, or availability of our van.
