Public Safety

The Boxborough Fire Department participates in the Commonwealth's Senior SAFE Program, coordinated by Capt. Jason Malinowski. The program offers the following free services to Boxborough homeowners who are at least 65 and older:

Home safety inspections.

- Smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) detector battery replacement.
- Provision/replacement of certain detection devices when in stock. Note this applies only to battery-powered devices, not those requiring hard wiring.
- Provision of key boxes to be placed on home exteriors for access by emergency services. Fire and police are the only ones with code access to the boxes.
- Check that houses are properly numbered to assist emergency personnel with locating the house in the event of an emergency.

To schedule a Senior SAFE home inspection, please call the Fire Department's non-emergency phone number at 978-264-1770 or email jmalinowski@boxborough-ma.gov. These home inspections are conducted by on-duty personnel, which means that they may be delayed in the event of an emergency call.

Spring Fitness with Holly

Registration will begin on **Monday, April 7** for Boxborough residents. Non-residents may register beginning **Thursday, April 17**, if space is available. Classes begin on **Monday, April 28** and run through **Friday, June 27**. All classes start at **9 AM**. Monday and Wednesday classes are held at the **Community Center**; Friday classes are via **Zoom**. Fees: \$4 per class. Eight Monday classes are \$32, nine Wednesday classes are \$36, nine Friday classes are \$36. Please make checks payable to the Town of Boxborough. You can register for one, two, or three classes per week. No classes will be held on Monday, May 26 or the week of June 30 to July 4. The next session will start on Monday, July 7.

Spring Birding with Becky



Our Town Clerk, Becky Harris, who also happens to be an ornithologist and conservation biologist, will lead participants on a walk as she identifies local birds. The walk will take place at **Flerra Meadows Field**, 340 Stow Road on **Tuesday, May 6 at 8:30 AM**. Be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes that you won't mind getting wet (due to morning dew) and bring binoculars if you have them. Please **RSVP** by May 1. This event is weather dependent. COA Van Services

COA van services are available to Boxborough residents age 60 or older, and to adults with disabilities age 18 and above. Rides are offered **Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM**. The van travels to towns bordering Boxborough and may be used for medical appointments and local errands for \$1 each way. Medical rides to Concord are \$1 each way. Medical rides to other towns are subject to availability and rates are based on distance. To book a ride, call 978-264-1730, preferably 2 days in advance.

We offer Boxborough 60+ adults and disabled adults transportation, through our **Go Boxborough!** program, to medical appointments that are outside the service area, time, or availability of our van. 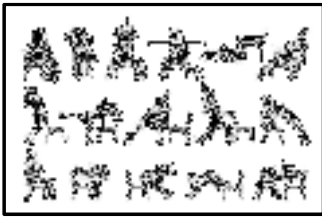
Community Gardens
