

### Special Town Meeting and Special Town Election

Boxborough will hold a Special Town Meeting (STM) on **Tuesday, December 10**, at the **Blanchard School gymnasium**. The meeting begins promptly at **7 PM**; check-in starts at **6:30 PM**.

You should have already received the Warrant for this STM. Article. 1 is about the Douglas and Gates Elementary School Building Project.



A Special Town Election to vote on funding the School Building Project will take place on **Tuesday, December 17**, at **Town Hall**. Polls will be open from **7 AM to 8 PM**.

The other five articles on the STM Warrant include: UMASS Amherst Economic Development Plan; Police Academy Training and Coverage; Acquisition of Easements for Route 111 Sidewalks; Payment of Prior Fiscal Year Bills; and Zoning By-Law Audit.

**NOTE:** *If necessary, the STM will continue on Wednesday, December 11, at 7 PM.*



## Spotlight: Nick Federico Treasurer/Tax Collector

If you pay your taxes at Boxborough's Town Hall, you most likely have met Nick Federico. Nick is one of the new members of the Town Hall workforce; he is our Town Treasurer/Tax Collector. A graduate of Bridgewater State College, Nick is a state-certified treasurer and is just a few short months away from obtaining his tax collector license from the Massachusetts Treasurers Association.

In his current role, Nick is responsible for the Town's payroll, debt management, plus property and excise tax collection. He also is responsible for Town employees' retirement plans and the general bank activity of the Town, including daily monitoring of the Town's financial assets and liabilities. While his job has a wide array of financial responsibilities, balancing the books is Nick's most enjoyable task. "I like it when all the books are balanced and things are clear and reconciled," says Federico. So do we!

Nick is currently pursuing his tax collector's license from UMass Amherst, where he attends seven classes for one week a year, culminating in an examination in August. Prior to accepting the position in Boxborough, Nick was the Town Treasurer/Tax Collector for Uxbridge. Nick hails from Dracut.


This is an annual holiday event followed by a visit from Santa, and refreshments on the lawn of the Historical Museum, just minutes from the tree lighting ceremony.

## Bedford Fix-it Shop – A Hidden Gem



If you need a watch battery replaced or small repairs on lamps, vacuums, or smaller appliances, the Fix-It Shop is the place to go. Another specialty of the Shop is sharpening knives and scissors. Located in Bedford at **12 Mudge Way** (behind the Bedford Town Hall), the Shop is a hidden treasure.

At this unique Shop, which has been in existence for at least 20 years, we met the receptionist, Susan, and six retired men who were working on various projects. The men work on **Tuesdays** and **Wednesdays** from **9 AM to noon**, and last year they put in 2,200 volunteer hours. They repair smaller, battery-run clocks quickly, and will glue wooden furniture back together. Susan told us that the most unusual item brought to the Shop for repairs was a lie detector!

The Shop is closed in July and August each year. The fee to replace watch batteries is \$5, and there is a \$3 minimum charge on any repair. This money supports the Friends of the Bedford Council on Aging.

## Clothes Dryer Safety

Do you clean your dryer's lint filter after every load? If so, good! However, take your filter to the sink and run hot water over it. Does the hot water sit on top of the mesh and not pass through it? If so, a film has formed on the mesh—you can't see it, but it's there!

The film is what's in a dryer sheet that makes your clothes soft and static free. You know how the sheets feel waxy when you take them out of the box? Well, that's what builds up on your clothes and your lint screen. That's also what potentially can cause dryer units to start a fire. To keep your dryer working safely for a long time (and lower your electric bill), take the filter out, wash it with hot soapy water, and scrub it with an old toothbrush at least every six months.

## Indian Hill Bach's Concerts

Attend free performances each month at the **Indian Hill Music School**, 36 King Street, Littleton. The concert series features Indian Hill faculty and orchestra members performing a variety of musical offerings ranging from classical and jazz to Broadway and folk.



Performances are offered once a month (typically the second Thursday) at 11 AM and 1:30 PM. The COA will be reserving a table and offering a van trip for the **1:30 PM** concert on **December 12**. Roundtrip cost for the van is **\$2** with pickup/drop off at your home or the Town Hall. **Reserved Boxborough seating is limited to 6 people**.
