Property Tax Exemption Options

Our Town Assessor, Sanders Genna, reminds us that there are property tax exemptions for the elderly, military, blind, disabled, and for spouses of active military who died in combat. Sandy will give a short presentation about the different exemption programs available at the start of our November 13 luncheon. These exemptions are income-based on a current income maximum of \$57,388. Your home is not considered in this calculation. However, anything else that can be turned into cash is considered. The maximum exemption allowed is \$487.03. All information provided to the Assessor's Office is confidential. If you feel you are eligible for an exemption, contact the Assessor's Office at 978-264-1721 to apply.

Senior Property Tax Work-Off

If you are a senior and have lived in Boxborough for one year, you may be eligible to participate in the Senior Property Tax Work-Off Program. The abatement amount earned through this program must be included in your gross income. You need to apply annually for the Tax Work-Off Program during the month of November, so stop by Town Hall and fill out an application.

The building will be located in West Acton and will also accommodate the Carol Huebner Early Childhood Program (CHECP.) Combining all three programs into a single building gives the District a solution to two elementary schools and CHECP in 3 years, rather than 10-15 years, at the lowest possible cost to the towns.
