Spotlight: File of Life

Medical emergencies can happen anytime. When they do, there is confusion, panic, and urgency. Paramedics arrive on the

scene with no information about the person in need. Seconds count, which can make the difference between life and death. Does the patient have prior medical conditions? Allergies? What medications are they taking? Whom do they want notified?

The File of Life card has all this information in one place. The card allows first responders to immediately begin the best possible treatment, notify loved ones, and pass vital data to physicians in the emergency room.

If you don't have a File of Life card, pick one up at the COA Office at Town Hall. If you have a File of Life card, be sure to update it every time your information changes. Your life may depend on it!
