

Trail Markings



Trail blazes differently colored based on what part of the trail they are on. Red signifies access trails, yellow is main trails, and Blue blazes are for side trails. In rolling meadows, these blazes are very clear, and junctions are well-marked



Good Trail Manners (Leave No Trace)

- Plan ahead and prepare.
- Travel on durable surfaces.
- Leave what you find (Leaves, feathers, etc).
- Respect wildlife.
- Be considerate of other visitors on the trail
